CANTORES IN ECCLESIA PRESENTS THE EIGHTEENTH ANNUAL WILLIAM BYRD FESTIVAL, AUGUST 7-23, IN PORTLAND, OREGON

English organist and conductor Mark Williams will return to Portland this summer to direct the award-winning choir Cantores in Ecclesia in a seventeen-day festival featuring choral masterpieces by the great Renaissance composer William Byrd (1540-1623) and his contemporaries. The complete festival schedule includes an organ recital on the world-class Rosales organ at Trinity Episcopal Cathedral, seven liturgical services, three public lectures, and a gala final concert, *VOX PATRIS: Sacred music by Byrd and his predecessors*. The final concert, at 7:30 pm on Sunday, August 23, will feature the magnificent twenty-minute motet *Vox patris caelestis* by William Mundy (c. 1529-1591) and a beautiful and little-known service by Byrd composed in honor of the Virgin Mary. Most of the festival events will take place at St. Stephen's Catholic Church, 1112 SE 41st Ave, with additional events at Holy Rosary Church in NE Portland and Trinity Episcopal Cathedral in NW Portland. Who: Cantores in Ecclesia, conducted by Mark Williams. Established thirty years ago, Cantores in Ecclesia provides Gregorian chant and sacred polyphony in liturgical contexts. The choir has sung in concert and for liturgies at home and abroad. The choir has recorded independently and for Oregon Catholic Press. Featured in print media and online with articles in BBC Music Magazine (August 1997), Brainstorm (February 2004), and The Early Music Review (2008), Cantores has established itself as a leader in liturgical and early music performance, winning loyal supporters at home and top honors in international competition. Now in residence at St. Stephen's Church 1112 SE 41st Ave, Portland, Cantores sings for the Solemn Latin Mass every Saturday at 7:30 PM.



Mark Williams is Director of Music, Fellow and College Lecturer at Jesus College Cambridge. After a year as Organ Scholar at Truro Cathedral, he studied at Trinity College Cambridge under Richard Marlow, where he was also the Organ Scholar and held an academic scholarship. In 2000, at the age of 21, he was appointed Assistant Organist of St Paul's Cathedral in London and Director of Music at St Paul's Cathedral School. He relinquished both posts in April of 2006 in order to pursue greater performing opportunities and for three years pursued a varied freelance career. He returned to Cambridge in 2009.

Mark Williams has appeared as organist and harpsichordist nationally and internationally with many of the UK's leading ensembles, including the London Philharmonic Orchestra, the City of London Sinfonia and the Gabrieli Consort and Players. As a conductor he has worked with Britten Sinfonia, the London Mozart Players, Saraband Consort and City of Prague Philharmonic Orchestra. He has appeared as organist and conductor annually since 2000 at the International William Byrd Festival in Portland Oregon, and has given solo recitals and led masterclasses in choral training, singing and organ performance in the UK, the USA, Asia and Africa. In March 2013, he led the Choir of Jesus College Cambridge in a pioneering collaboration with the charity Songbound working with children in the slums of Mumbai continuing this educational work in Sri Lanka in December 2014. Under his direction, the Choir has released four discs, the last of which entered the UK Classical Charts at No. 1 in February 2015. He is the Chief Guest Conductor of the City of London Choir, a Fellow of the Royal College of Organists, a Freeman of the City of London, and a trustee of Cambridge Early Music, the Oundle Music Trust, the Harlton Organ Trust, the Muze Music Trust in Zambia and Songbound in India. He is the Honorary President of the Chamber Choir of Erne Integrated College in Enniskillen.

In addition to writing and arranging music for television and radio, Mark Williams has performed on a number of film soundtracks and has acted as music consultant for television programmes including the popular crime drama, *Endeavour*. He appears on CD with the Choir of Jesus College Cambridge, the Choir of Trinity College Cambridge and Richard Marlow, the Royal Philharmonic Orchestra, the Cambridge Singers and John Rutter, the Bournemouth Symphony Orchestra, the City of Prague Philharmonic Orchestra, Retrospect Ensemble, The King's Consort, The Sixteen, Arcangelo and Cantores in Ecclesia.
